THE MELTING POT: AN AFRICAN ODYSSEY

- A romp through the last 200 years - 60min talk time

South Africa is a relatively young country but has a fascinating history. The status quo changed markedly with the arrival of the Nguni people around 1,300 years ago. Trade, shipping, refreshment requirements, religious persecution in Europe, and the Napoleonic Wars saw many Europeans settling in the Cape. Inevitably clashes arose, largely on account of land, but not exclusively so. This country provides a rich kaleidoscope of landscapes and characters worth sharing. The discovery of diamonds and gold eventually led to major wars breaking out at the end of the 1800's.

FLICKERING EMBERS

- Stoking the theatre of the imagination - 60min talk time

Campfires are always associated with storytelling, especially in Africa. In the tradition of raconteurs of old, Rob loves the freedom to ease from one story to another in this format. Young George Buntting is accompanied by a Zulu chaperone for a 200 km/l20-mile horse ride to catch the train to school. Harry Wolhuter's famous escape from the jaws of a lion by stabbing it to death with a knife. Deep within us all lies an innate desire to be carried along by a story developed within the theatres of our imaginations. This continent provides a canvas for the richest of stories.

OF MIGHT AND ICE

- Ernest Shackleton - 60min talk time

Greatest leadership and survival story of all time

Ernest Shackleton began his Antarctic exploration career alongside Scott onboard Discovery. In 1907-1909 off Nimrod, engaging cavalier methods of motor sledges, Siberian ponies, dogs and man-hauling sledges, Shackleton's party chartered a route up the Beardmore Glacier and got to within 97 miles / 150 km of the South Pole. Amundsen was first to the South Pole. Shackleton then decided to attempt a crossing of Antarctica from west to east via the South Pole. In January 1915 his ship Endurance was trapped in the ice of the Weddell Sea and eventually crushed. This left 28 men and 57 dogs afloat on the sea ice. What followed is considered the greatest survival story of the modern age.
